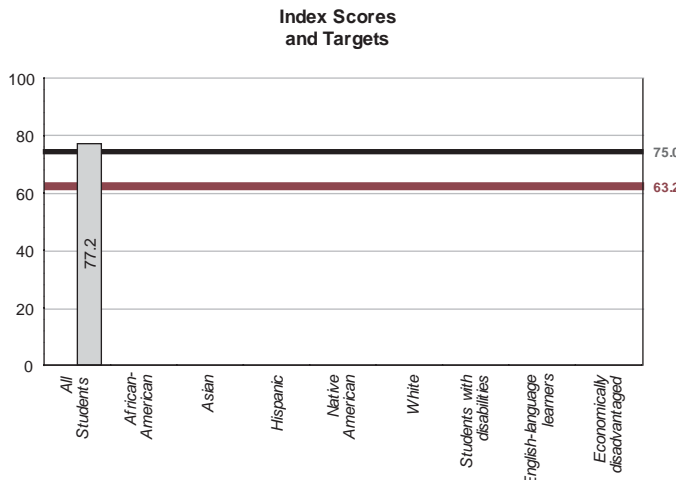

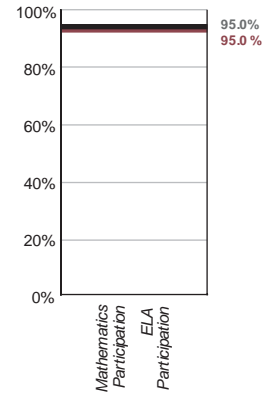
English Language Arts

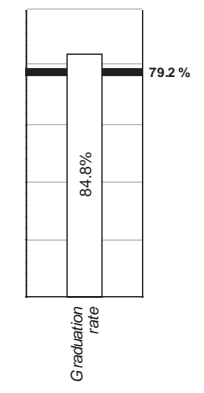

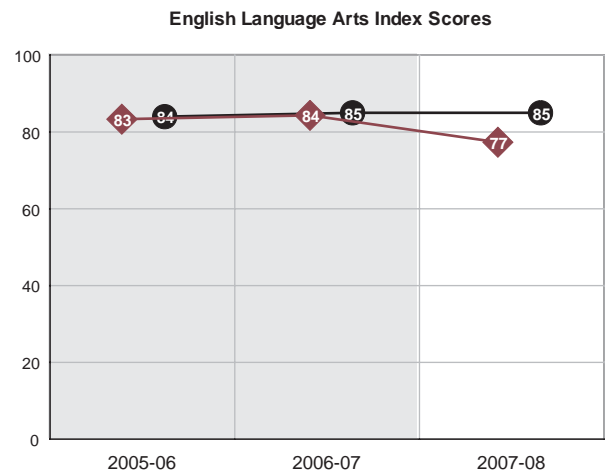
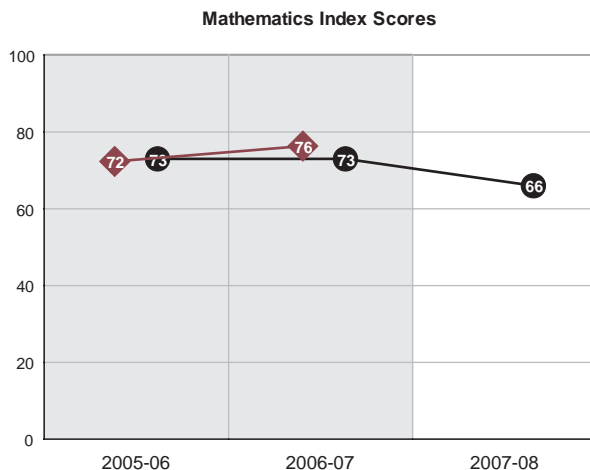
